12 Slovak host families welcomed in February 2017 a delegation from 5 European countries. The project is being implemented within Erasmus programme within which children spent five wonderful days in the Slovak town of Košice.

- They found good friends.

- The habits are quite similar.
- > There are some different traditions.
- > Different eating habits or daily routines were observed.

How did you spend your free time?

- They spent their free time mostly together with other host kids and their schoolmates.
- They played games, talked about themselves, listened to the music, played musical instruments, had fun.

What are the eating habits that exist in your friend's country?


- Most of them are very similar.
