What is Inclusive Education?

ATTEND AND ARE WELCOMED BY THEIR NEIGHBORHOOD SCHOOLS IN AGE-APPROPRIATE, REGULAR CLASSES AND ARE SUPPORTED TO LEARN, CONTRIBUTE AND PARTICIPATE IN ALL ASPECTS OF THE LIFE OF THE SCHOOL.

What we expected.....

- a plan to support teachers and students through good inclusive practices
- professional development for all teachers involved
- reduced class size based on the severity of the student needs
- support to the teachers by special pedagogues
- the presence of personal assistents in classrooms
- collaboration between parents, teachers and administrators

What we have.....

- classes up to 28 students
- no personal assistents in classrooms
- no methodical materials focused on needs of a particular student
- often without collaboration of parents
- we are concerned that we are being controlled more than we are supported

Everyday Reality

Teachers:

- We prepare fill-in-the-gap excercises for each student in particular class
- We select special activities for them
- With big amount of pupils in classes diferenciation is not possible in a way that would be satisfactory
- Parents expect to do all the work by teachers getting a "paper" from a specialist does their part of the work, they don't have/want spend the necessary extra time with their child

Pupils

- They are lost sometimes in spite the fact they study a lot and their parents are really helpful. Spending lots of time... They sometimes do not feel the success that would be equal to their effort
- "I have a paper, I do not have to" The parents expect from us all work done at school and without objective evaluation. These kids attitude from home is " I do not have to do this because......"
- Due to the amount integrated kids (with various diagnoses) in our classrooms often one group is disadvantaged.

Specialist help at school

- School has a psychologist, who is at school a few hours a month checking the documentation of integrated children with the school educational adviser
- These kids attend appointments with a special pedagogist and/or usually once a year
- Educational adviser at school who is gathering the documentation from specialists and teachers as well

But....

- children are AWESOME and we try to do our BEST
- and we LOVE them....

TOPS from kids

- Extra material from the teacher
- Extra explanation if needed
- Help from other pupils
- Not having grades for some tasks
- Fun in classes
- Attitude of some teachers
- Not having to do some tasks

TIPS from kids

- Have to study much more
- Not having such good grades
- Some tasks are very hard
- Feel lost sometimes
- Demotivation
- Parents do not have enough time or do cannot help in some subjects
